Pivotal Response Treatment Robert and Lynn Koegel Stanford University School of Medicine Psychoanalytic Treatment ☐ Prior to ABA, professionals were primarily trained in psychoanalytic treatment ☐ Blamed parents – especially mothers ■ Refrigerator mothers ■ Mentally ill mothers Resulted in severe emotionally and financially costly results for both parents an children ABA evolution of DTT ☐ Through ABA new variables were identified. ☐ Choice, Interspersal, Natural Reiforcers, Reinforcing Attempts. ☐ Resulted in dramatic improvements in gains, efficiency, and generalization.



Structured ABA vs. PRT

- ☐ Results: (Koegel, O'Dell, & Koegel, 1987)
 - Increase in immediate and deferred imitations
 - Increase in spontaneous utterances
 - Generalization of imitative and spontaneous utterances
